A late start to the 2002 cricket season was again forced upon us by the wet spring but it finally got going with a very enjoyable curtain raiser when representative teams from The Plough and The Queen's I Head played each other on June 16. We have a full program of fixtures this summer and if you would like to join us please get in touch: We will be delighted to hear from you; new members are always welcome. Cricketing skill is not a requirement – we have all standards of player including youngsters and the matches, although hard fought, are not taken too seriously. We run a small league consisting of The Carpenter's Arms, Dunstable Road Runners, The Victoria and our own representative Plough XI. Last summer we won the league by a whisker, after a severely reduced fixture list imposed on us by the appalling weather.

The committee of the club are working very hard to keep the club going despite severe financial constraints. Major expenses include insurance and equipment maintenance. We will be holding another quiz at the Memorial Hall later in the year to top up the club funds – keep your eyes open for the publicity – these events are always popular and support from the village is always welcome. We also have an ambitious plan to build an all weather pitch and hope the Lottery will look upon our application with favour.

We are currently in the process of preparing a permanent nets area in one corner of the ground to enable us to practise. This is not a word that many of our members would readily recognise; most of the current practise sessions take place with one elbow on the bar of one of our local pubs, but we are keen to improve both our game and the facilities we provide for our members. We also need to raise some more cash to complete the fund for the provision of an all weather pitch – an expensive but valuable facility which will allow us to play more matches.

The Plough XI vs. The Queen's Head XI

The afternoon of June 16 saw the annual clash of the titans, when teams from The Plough in Wingfield and The Queen's Head in Tebworth locked in cricket combat. This was the first match to be played on the Wingfield ground in the 2002 season – an excellent curtain raiser.

Preparation by the expert ground staff (Tony Cornes, Mike Wells and Sam Fenwick and Neville Andrews) resulted in an immaculate pitch, clearly the envy of the groundsman at Lord's, who popped up to get some advice!! The outfield was a picture of a smooth and lush sward marred only by the occasional dandelion and molehill.

With a warm sun shining, twenty two finely tuned athletes took to the field, only one or two muttering that they hadn't finished their beer when they had been dragged from the pub.

The Plough won the toss and captain David Cestaro opted to bat first. Simon Noake and Roger Masters (the latter hotly denying divided loyalty) opening the batting in this thirty over match.

The Plough managed to accrue 128 runs for 7 wickets in their allotted 30 overs, with notable contributions from Roger Masters (23), Gary Brown (21) and Captain Cestaro (22 not out). Star bowlers for the QH were Mike Finch (4 wickets for 18) and Richard Masters (2 for 15). A chap called Extras actually managed 41 runs, all wides except for one no ball which very nearly removed Gary's head.

At the interval, all the players and a not inconsiderable number of spectators enjoyed a splendid tea laid on by Frances Masters. Sincere thanks to her; she will be welcome at any of our matches this summer.

Despite their rigorous and lengthy period of training in the public bar, the Queen's Head XI failed to overcome the target set by the Plough, being bowled out for 71 after 23 overs. Young Matt Chinery demonstrated some excellent batting, coming in at 4 and finishing 26 not out, having run out of batting partners. Captain Peter Hadden (10) and David Ralley (11) were the only other batsmen to reach double figures. Plough bowling honours were spread around but Sam Fenwick and Neville Andrews took two wickets each.

So this year's result – a win for The Plough by 57 runs.

Another summer has gone by and the weather has been as bad as we all feared.

The Chalgrave and District Friendly Cricket League however managed to finish all it's fixtures and we regret to report that last seasons winners - The Plough, Wingfield - somehow managed to come last this time! The Carpenter's Arms, Harlington were the winners.

The early summer months were very wet and so it was not until middle summer that the sports ground was fit to have cricket played on it, and then not every weekend. However, this was compensated by the dry end to summer allowing us to play cricket up to the last weekend in October! Which must be some form of record. A full report of the season will appear in the next magazine.

Further improvements to the sports ground have taken place this year.

Apart from work on cleaning up the pavilion, the cricket practise net has been improved after being decimated by the moles (which have now been removed - with thanks to our resident mole catcher and assistants!). A concrete base has been laid and various matting obtained which will allow anyone who wants to use the nets next year to do so even when the outfield is damp.

The major project of obtaining an all weather cricket pitch is still moving on. The total cost will be around £8000 of which we have raised £5000 and are hoping to fundraise the rest as soon as possible, although a generous benefactor would not go amiss!

Once we have this facility it will allow cricket to be played safely (especially for children) in damp conditions without damaging the square. It will also allow us to let anyone who wants to use the cricket pitch to practise whenever they want which they are not able to do at the present time.

Finally a big thank you to all those who have helped us out in many ways over the past year.



The annual 10-10 competition (subtitled Festival of Cricket), originally scheduled for June, eventually took place on August Bank Holiday Monday at the ground in Wingfield. After a quite dreadful summer (you may remember) with no cricket having been played for nearly two months in the middle of the season, it was a pleasure to see the players out in their whites (albeit under grey skies!).

A brief guide to the rules:

10 overs per side. All players bar the wicket keeper must bowl one over each. Batsmen retire after scoring 10 (or more) runs. 6 runs permitted to be scored on the non-road boundaries. Four matches played in a minileague with the top two teams playing in the final. Full rules on the website!

With a none too certain weather forecast the committee had pressed on regardless with the preparations and by the end of a long (and hot!) Saturday everything was ready – grass cut, the Heras fencing in place, the gazebo and players' tents erected and the bar suitably stocked.

Monday morning came and people started arriving to help with the setting up – and what's this I spy? It's several members of The Vic cricket team, having clearly got lost as they're never early! Finally, we have representatives from three of the teams so the draw is done for the first match – which is to be Road Runners vs The Plough.

In their innings Road Runners made 64 for 6 which proved to be too low a target as The Plough eased past scoring 65 for 4 in 8.4 overs with 4 batsmen retiring.

At this point we realised that the fourth team were not going to show up, so Chalgrave All Stars was born – the idea being that an extra team be 'created' from the spare (and willing) players from the remaining sides. After a little shuffling of pieces of paper in a hat the next match was on – All Stars vs The Vic.

The All Stars batted strongly, posting 75 without loss. In reply The Vic could only manage 56 for 3 in their allotted overs, never really recovering from Alan C's six and out off the third ball of the innings which clearly unbalanced them (some may say they started that way...)

Onto match 3 after a brief break for lunch – The Plough now faced The Vic. Charles won the toss and decided to bat, a decision he came to regret as the opening pair found it very difficult to score against a determined Vic bowling line up. After 6 overs the score was only 25, and despite rallying towards the end the final total was 53 for 1. The Plough's bowling and fielding display was spirited, but The Vic easily reached their target in the 9th over, finishing on 54 for 5.

And so the to final match of the round robin part of the day - All Stars vs Road Runners. The match started in explosive fashion and, in one of the most aggressive batting displays seen in a 10-10 competition, the All Stars fairly romped away, scoring 70 from the first 6 overs. They could not maintain that rate, however, and finished on 81 for 4 - a nonetheless daunting target for their opponents. Road Runners set about their task in determined style, taking 13 off their first over. But after 5 overs the score was 37 – surely they had left themselves too much to do? At the start of the final over they stood at 67 for 3, requiring 15 to win. Through a combination of loose bowling and remarkable batting, the penultimate ball was hit for four giving them a fantastic victory - truly well-deserved and a great performance.

With all of the league matches played, all three teams had won one game and lost one game. The organisers decided to use the number of retiring batsmen to choose which two teams should meet in the final – these being The Plough and Road Runners.

The scene was set for an epic final. The Plough batted first, started well and kept their momentum going throughout, posting a creditable 79 for 2. But having seen the Road Runners form earlier on would that be enough? Half way through the Road Runners innings they were 34 for 1, and with one over remaining they were 70 for 2 – leaving them needing 10 from the final over to take the trophy. The first ball was despatched to the boundary -6 from 5 balls. But from that point on every ball was on the spot, making it impossible for the batsmen to score more than a single. So The Plough were 10-10 Champions once more. It was an excellent way to finish the day with a tight, tense finish and played in wonderful spirits.

Break-in at the Clubhouse

It is with dismay that I have to report another break-in at the clubhouse – this time more disruptive and dangerous than we have previously experienced.

On the afternoon of Saturday 28th
September we were alerted by a
neighbour that a window at the clubhouse
was broken. When another neighbour
checked this report he found that one of the
main windows had indeed been broken and
damage caused inside the building. Our

groundsman, Nev arrived at around 6.30 pm and whilst assessing the scene noticed a youth on the opposite side of the field. As he approached him, two further youths appeared from the caravan parked on the far side of the ground. When Nev shouted to them to stop they 'ran like scalded cats' out of the ground by the footpath entrance in Tebworth Road, opposite New Farm. Two of them were wearing black hoodies and the other a red hoodie. When he returned to his car and drove down Tebworth Road towards The Plough, Nev saw no sign of the youths anywhere.

The damage caused in the clubhouse was light – but the window has had to be boarded up. They had obviously attempted to enter the clubhouse through a back door as there was damage there which will also require repairs.

Of most concern is that they left a large amount of broken beer bottles on the field, with obvious consequences to people walking their dogs, and also wildlife. This has taken some time to clear up – and finding shards of broken green bottles on grass is not easy. It appears that they were making petrol bombs as there were not only the glass bottles, but melted plastic bottles and cups along with charred rags and paper towels strewn across the ground – and many burnt patches of grass in one particular area of the field. All of this had taken place in broad daylight.

The matter has been reported to the police, but if anyone saw or heard anything on that Saturday afternoon that may be relevant then I appeal to them to report the matter either to myself (01525 877098) or Roger Burden at The Plough (01525 873077).
